






### PIT Demographics: Age & Gender







### PIT Demographics: Race & Ethnicity






## PIT Demographics: Household Composition & Other


- The 2020 Notice of Funding Availability release has been delayed due to COVID-19

### Currently Identified Funding Priorities

#### 1. Emergency Shelter Operations

• Support to homeless shelters to prepare, prevent and maintain operations during COVID-19.

### 2. Motel/Hotel Voucher Program, including street outreach

- New program in coordination with HAD for centralized coordination and DHSS, and DSSC, to provide immediate motel vouchers to clients experiencing homelessness.
- The jurisdictions will collaborate to produce a shared set of forms and documents to make administration easier.

#### 3. Rapid Rehousing

• Provide existing rapid rehousing providers funding to maintain current housing supports as well as to work with clients in hotel/motels exit from shelter to permanent housing.

#### 4. Homeless Prevention

• Rental Assistance, Utility Assistance, Legal Services.
